MINUTES OF WORK SESSION

DESCHUTES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS

WEDNESDAY, MAY 25, 2016

Present were Commissioners Alan Unger and Anthony DeBone; Commissioner Tammy Baney was out of the office. Also present were County Administrator Tom Anderson; Deputy County Administrator Erik Kropp; County Counsel David Doyle; Chris Doty and George Kolb, Road Department; and Susan Ross and Lee Randall, Property & Facilities. No representatives of the media or other citizens were in attendance.

Chair Unger opened the meeting at 1:32 p.m.

1. Request for Grant Application Approval – Federal Lands Access Program

Chris Doty and George Kolb of the Road Department were present to review the success of the Federal Lands Access Program (FLAP). The funding application would be for work done in fiscal year 2019. Three projects will be candidates for funding applications: Cascade Lakes Highway chip seal and shoulder work, George Millican Road chip seal, and a Cascade Lakes Highway bicycle safety study. The Cascade Lakes Highway chip seal and shoulder work is intended to include a 25% match. The George Millican Road chip seal project will be a joint application with Crook County and will include a 50% match split between each county.

Discussion was held on the Cascade Lakes Highway bicycle safety study. There are safety concerns and a comprehensive study could evaluate any necessary improvements to accommodate cycling.

Other projects were considered, but are not a part of the application for funding: Crooked River Ranch alternative access, Three Creeks Road overlay, 45 Road from Sunriver to Mt. Bachelor, and Cascade Lakes Highway right-of-way clearing and parking study. The parking study would be an item done due to a safety concern with the Forest service parking areas being overcrowded, and the Forest Service wants to enforce against illegal parking in those areas that causes spillover onto the highway.

The Road Department is requesting consideration of approval to submit the FLAP application on the top three priority projects by the July 1 deadline. There is a project prioritization committee that includes ODOT and the Forest Service that reviews all applications.



- 1. Cascade Lakes Highway chip seal and shoulder work
 - a. End Red Cinder Oil Mat (MP 33+/-) to Klamath (MP 62 +/-), 29 miles
 - b. FY19 only
 - c. \$1.77M estimate: 25% match (\$1.33M in funding for \$442k match)
- 2. Geo Millican Road chip seal
 - a. Joint application potential with Crook County
 - b. 50% Match (\$700k total project, \$350k match or \$175k each county)
 - c. FY 19 only
 - d. 7.5 miles of DC, 7.5 miles of CC
- 3. Cascade Lakes Highway: Bicycle safety study
 - a. What facilities are appropriate for CLH given the seasonal nature, traffic volumes, and limited width facilities

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE POLICY BLDG-1

Attached is the revised Facilities Maintenance Policy that we discussed at previous work sessions. The primary purpose of the revision was to include a statement regarding centralization of all capital construction within the Property & Facilities Department as recommended by an internal audit conducted several years ago.

We also took the opportunity to update the language to refer to the "Property & Facilities Department" instead of "Building Services" and included paragraph #4 dealing with items attached to the ceiling (our number one fire code violation each year).

All changes are in red so that you can easily track them. Staff requests Board approval and authorization of County Administrator signature of Policy No. BLDG-1.

FACILITIES MAINTENANCE POLICY

STATEMENT OF POLICY

It is the policy of Deschutes County to maintain continuity and appearance of county facilities, facilitate ease of maintenance, extend the life of assets, <u>comply with safety protocols</u>, and to establish consistent standards for use of County facilities.

APPLICABILITY

This policy applies to all County personnel and all other individuals who use County facilities.

POLICY AND PROCEDURES

- 1. Where feasible, full-height panels systems instead of hard walls will be used to create separation of spaces. This will allow flexibility in the future if the space needs to again be reconfigured.
- 2. Animals are not allowed in County facilities, including County vehicles. The exceptions are certified service animals and treatment animals that are both licensed and insured. Fish tanks are permitted.
- 3. Space heaters are not permitted unless required for medical reasons. Heaters upset the heating/cooling systems and the electrical system and can become fire hazards. If an individual heater is approved, it will be-provided by Property & Facilities. Other Aappliances, such as coffee makers that do not have automatic shutoffs (such as certain types of coffee makers) are prohibited.
- 4. No items are to be attached to the ceilings. Items such as plants, decorative lights, and other types of decorations are not to be hung on the ceiling or attached to the ceiling grid. These types of items can block required emergency signage and notification devices or sprinkler heads, and may put too much strain on the ceiling grid.
- 54. All furniture purchases must be ordered through the Property & Facilities

 DepartmentBuilding Services. The furniture will be pre-assembled and will consist of a standard finish to match existing County furniture. Desk and work surfaces will be height adjustable by crank, electric motor, or torsion lever.
- 65. Chair mats are required at all desk areas to reduce the wear and tear on carpets.
- 76. County buildings and individual offices are to be painted the standard color(s) as established by <u>Building ServicesProperty & Facilities</u>. All painting must be conducted by <u>Building ServicesProperty & Facilities</u>.

- <u>Building Services Property & Facilities</u> will establish the standards for window <u>blindstreatments</u>, light <u>fixtures bulbs</u>, <u>flooringearpet</u>, <u>vinyl</u>, laminate, and other finishes. <u>Building Services Property & Facilities</u> will be responsible for ordering and installing these items.
- 98. Services of outside contractors (such as electricians) will be acquired by Building Services Property & Facilities. Individual employees or departments should not hire contractors to perform work in County facilities.
- 109. All requests for remodels or construction are to be submitted to the Director of Property & Facilities. Work requests for routine maintenance are to be submitted to the Building Services Manager through the electronic work order system.
- 11. All requests for remodels, construction, or office reconfigurations are to be submitted to the Director of Property & Facilities. Oversight and management of capital construction projects for facilities that are intended for tenancy or occupancy is to be centralized within the Property & Facilities Department.

 Departments that oversee facilities that are not occupied such as landfills and roads are responsible for their own capital construction oversight and management, although Property & Facilities may be engaged to act in a consultant role if requested by the managing department.

Any exceptions to this policy must be approved by the County Administrator or his/her designee.
