BACKGROUND AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS:

The Deschutes County Sheriff's Office proposes to apply for the grant to support ongoing preparedness and homeland security activities including maintaining a contemporary Emergency Operations Plan, providing training to better manage large-scale incidents, and to provide interoperable communications. The Deschutes County Sheriff's Office is requesting the Board of Commissioners' approval to submit a grant application on behalf of the County. A summary of the grant opportunity follows.

Program: FY 2016 State Homeland Security Program

The Sheriff's Office is applying on behalf of the county for the FY 2016 State Homeland Security Program. Identified potential projects include:

1. Conversion of the Deschutes County Emergency Operations Plan to an 18 ESF version - \$16,000
2. Position Specific Incident Command Training (Regional Project) - \$100,000
3. Interoperable communications / radio purchases for City of Redmond – To be determined

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Funding Agency: United States Department of Homeland Security (DHS) through the Oregon Office of Emergency Management (OEM).

Due Date: Application: January 22, 2015
Amount: No more than \$200,000 (if all projects funded)
Matching Funds: No match required
Duration: **October 1, 2016** through September 30, 2018

Background: If the County is awarded the funds, OEM will issue a formal grant document which will be presented to the Board/County Administrator for signature.

Reporting: Sgt. Garibay, the Deschutes County Emergency Manager, will be responsible for meeting reporting requirements to ODF.
