

Of the three Central Oregon counties, Crook County has the highest percent of adults who smoke.



Drug Poisoning Death Rates



Opioid Prescription Fill Rate




Opioid prescription fills (per 1,000 population) are gradually decreasing in Central Oregon and in Oregon as a whole.

Over the past year and a half, Crook County has consistently had the highest number of opioid prescription fills per population. This means that in the second quarter of 2017, for every 1,000 Crook County residents, around 300 opioid prescriptions were filled.


