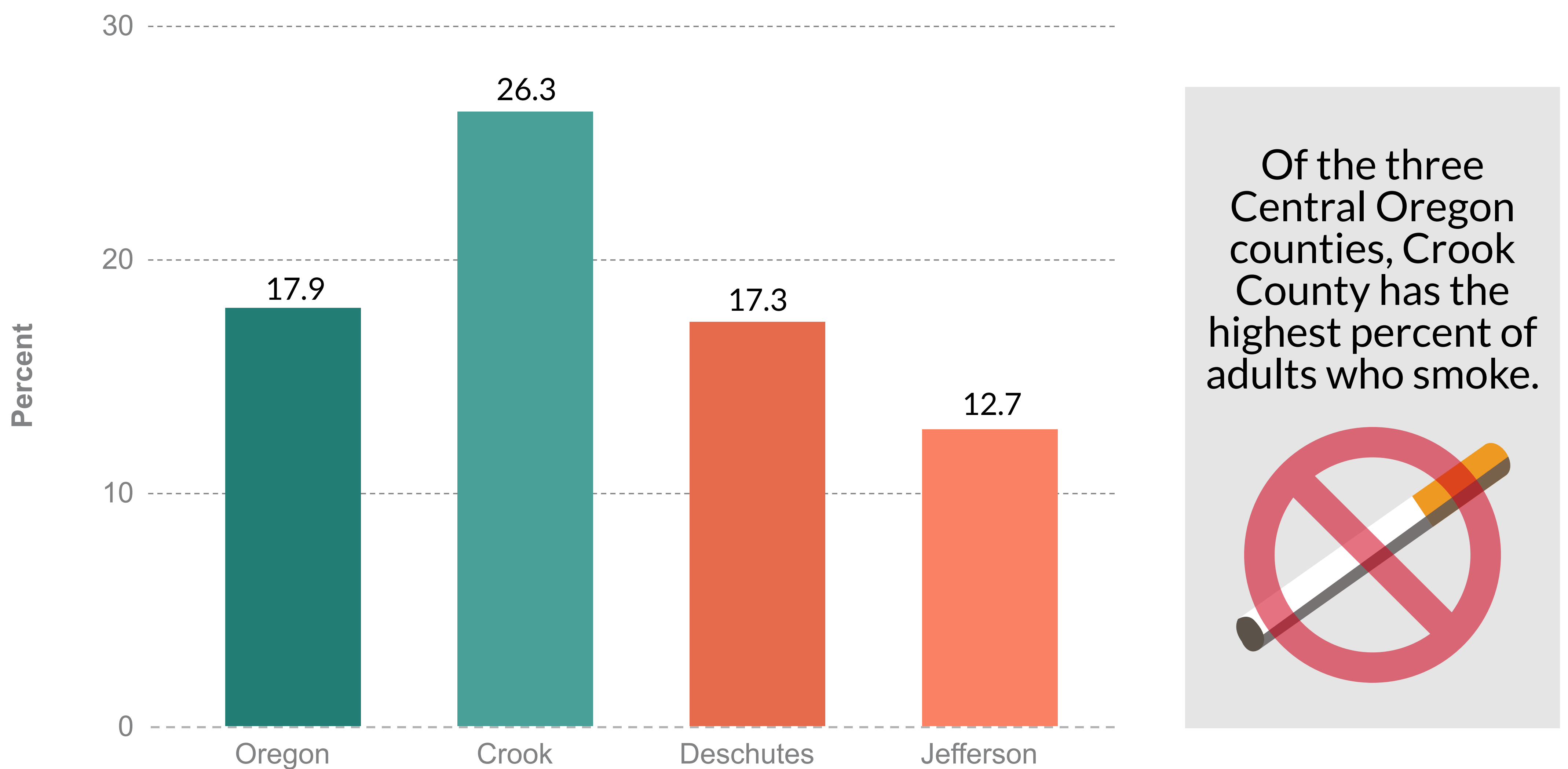

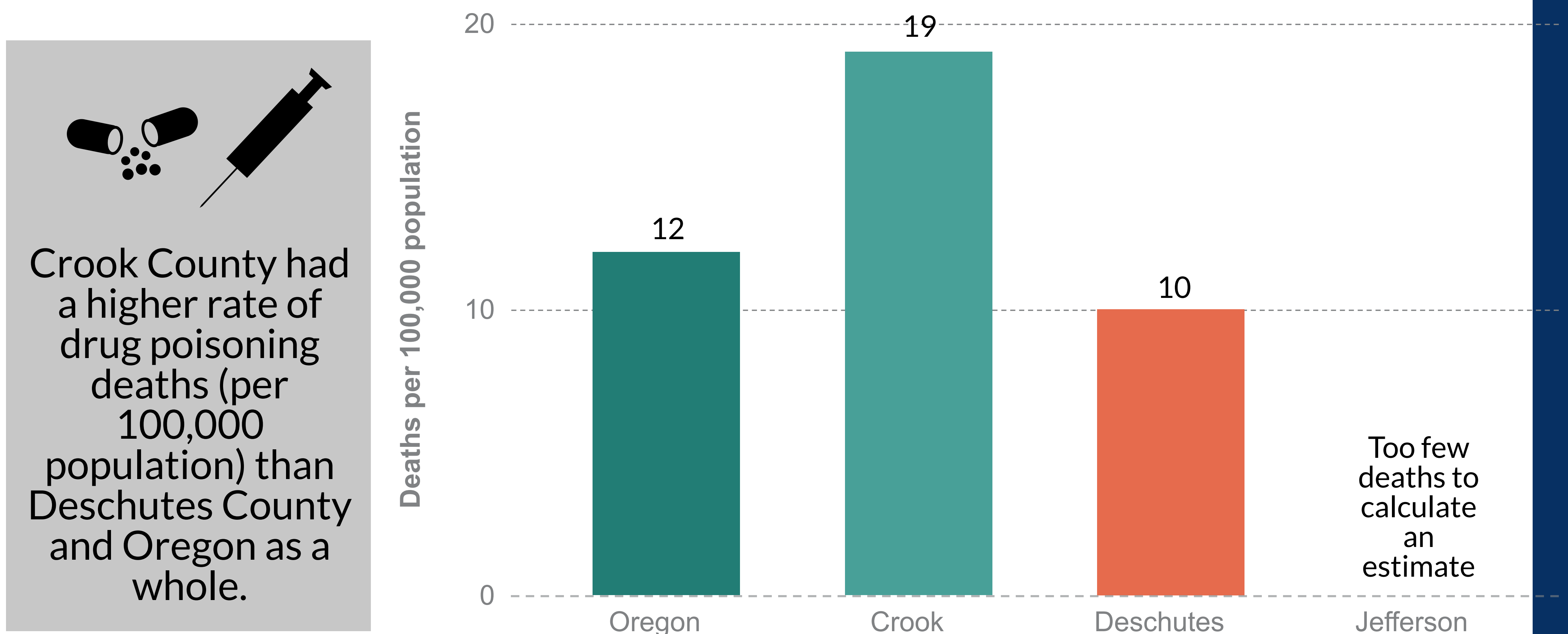

Percent of Adults who Smoke



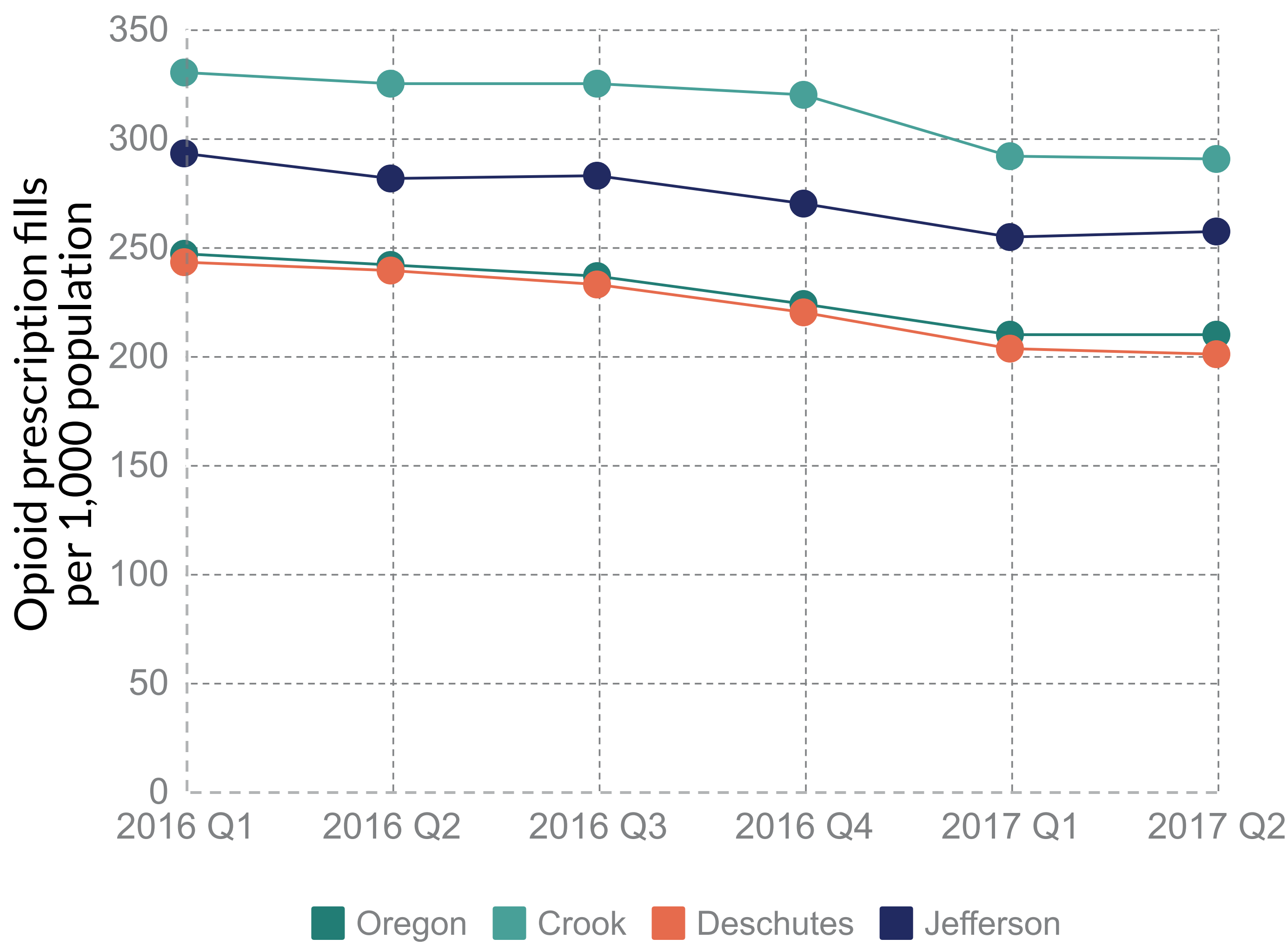

Opioid Prescription Fill Rate



Opioid prescription fills (per 1,000 population) are gradually decreasing in Central Oregon and in Oregon as a whole.

Over the past year and a half, Crook County has consistently had the highest number of opioid prescription fills per population. This means that in the second quarter of 2017, for every 1,000 Crook County residents, around 300 opioid prescriptions were filled.

Opioid-related death rate



Opioid-related death rates have been lower in Deschutes County than in Oregon since 2001.
