Is the proposal for 24/7 Security, or 8 to 10 hour shifts daily, and if so how many days each week and what hours?

Deschutes County response: The request is for daily shifts ranging from 8 to 10 hours, with the option to expand to 24/7 coverage at a later time in the near future should the need arise.
